

On to the news.

There's a protest scheduled for Saturday at the flagpole over actions taken by the Trump administration.

A <u>Facebook event</u> for a Saturday, February 15 protest from 3 to 4:30 p.m. created by Forest Grove City Councilor Donna Gustafson has attracted 50 participants who marked themselves as going or interested.

The protest will be held at the giant flagpole east of Safeway between Pacific Ave. and 19th Way.

"Stand up for democracy and fight the autocratic takeover of our country," the event's description read, noting the protest was intended as peaceful.

"We'll be protesting the attempted coup, the illegal access to the treasury department, the attempt at abolishing [DEI] and I'm sure a slew of other things," Gustafson said in an email to News in the Grove.

Gustafson clarified that while she organized the protest as a city councilor, it was not an official city council event.

�� High school activities for Friday evening are back on a voluntary basis.

"High school activities and practices for Friday, February 14th may take place after 5:30 pm," the Forest Grove School District said. "Participation is optional and based on coaches' and teachers' individual communications to families. Please do not travel to the high school without communication from your student's coach or teacher. Students who are unable or choose not to participate will not be penalized."

"All activities, practices, and competitions for students/youth in grades K-8 are cancelled."

"Speaking with people in NW Oregon about issues that affect their lives is an important part of my work," Bonamici said. "I invite everyone to attend one of these town hall meetings to hear about the challenges and opportunities in this session of Congress." The event is in Hillsboro.




