

## This is what happened to your electricity today

"We are on scene of a non-injury crash at the intersection of Yew Street and 24th Avenue," Forest Grove Fire & Rescue said. "The vehicle collided with a power pole, severely damaging it and knocking out power to the surrounding area."

There was a lot of confusion this week over a federal order freezing funding. It's now been halted by judicial action, and withdrawn by the White House, but before all that happened, we reached out to local government bodies, including the city, for their take on how it could affect them. You might not know it, but almost every government jurisdiction, down to the smallest level, often relies on funds, either grants or loans, from the feds for a variety of programs and services.

Here's the story I wrote on that; if you're looking for a top level overview of the actual order and what happened, find that in your favorite national-level news source. I focused on the local impacts.

"The city is doing due diligence with all of our partners to find out the status of funding for all our projects with federal funds," Forest

Grove City Manager Jesse VanderZanden said in a phone call with News in the Grove.

Before I close the books on this one, here are statements from a couple more local governing bodies that came in after press time:

# **Washington County**

"Washington County continues to monitor and assess the impact of the recent executive orders and federal actions," said Washington County spokesperson Philip Bransford in an email to News in the Grove. "Washington County receives a significant amount of federal grants, at least \$200 million currently, some over a multiple-year period, to support various services we provide to the community every day. Any disruption to federal funding received or awarded to the County would considerably impact the vital services we provide to our community. Our primary goal is to minimize service disruptions that could directly harm the safety and health of our community members and support our community-based partners the best we can with our limited resources."

### Metro

"Right now, there are many questions and little clarity about what the federal government is doing. I'm relieved the White House withdrew the order," said Metro Council President Lynn Peterson in a statement furnished to News in the Grove. "That said, nothing that happens at the federal level changes our mission or our values, and we remain hard at work. Supportive housing services have kept thousands of families from being evicted and got thousands more into housing. Our planning department coordinates with 24 cities and towns to make our roads safer. We manage the garbage and recycling systems. Our parks department oversees 18,000 acres of Oregon habitat. And we're all eagerly awaiting the arrival of a baby elephant at the Oregon Zoo. The work we do directly impacts the 1.7 million people we serve, and we will not be deterred from it."


